Program Features:

The program endeavors practice-oriented learning as well as students' integration in professional environment and research activities. Compulsory elements entail working groups oriented towards the development of various practical and research skills. Legal clinics ensure broader guidance and teach how to choose effective ways for resolving common problems of the society. Student learns by Doing.

The program ensures integrated teaching enabling to understand historical background of various legal institutes and to interrelate issues of different disciplines. Program components complement one another. In teaching methodology prevails comparative teaching and retrieving the gained competences through reiteration (repetitorium) in private, public and criminal law with integrated international law elements, facilitates the entry into a professional life.

Program structure:

The undergraduate program of law consists of 240 ECTS distributed as follows:

147 ECTS - core courses for the formation of a uniform standard of knowledge and professional skills.

18 to 22 ECTS – repetitoriums in private, public, and criminal laws.

12 ECTS – practical component at university legal aid office.

59 to 63 ECTS – a wide selection of elective courses, including courses from other bachelor's programs up to 30 ECTS.

Program aims:

The program aims to expand individual's awareness by appreciation of the meaning of law. It aims to promote comparative legal researches, international achievements. The

- program focuses on encouraging development of professional skills and formation of justice-based values.
- Acquiring knowledge and competence in Private, Public, Criminal and International Law enables individual to conduct any type of work that does not require Master degree in law. State certification exam may be precondition of particular profession.

Learning outcomes:

Knowledge and Understanding

1. Describes the essence of law, methods, sources of Georgian law, stages of their development and their relation to individual branches of law, fundamental principles and institutions for the formation of the modern national legal system, as well as the key concepts, principles and theories of special areas (public, private, criminal and international law) of law.
2. Demonstrates knowledge in the following areas:
 - Constitutional values,
 - Key issues of state organization and local self-governance,
 - Basic human rights and freedoms, principles of their limitation, taking into account of application specifics in national Law;
 - Basic principles of public international law and the mechanisms of international legal responsibility, their relation to national law;
 - Systemic concepts of private law, contractual and legal obligational relations, property law, labor law, corporate law;

- The essence and principles of administrative law, the principles and forms of activity of administrative body, peculiarities of administrative proceedings;
- Principles of criminal law, essence of crime and its types and the system and features of criminal responsibility;
- Stages and principles of civil, administrative, criminal and constitutional proceedings;
- Alternative means of dispute resolution.

Skills

3. Reveals complex and unforeseen problems in the field of law and provides their well-grounded individual or alternative solutions from a broad perspective, based on a complex vision, finding and analyzing facts, rules and relevant sources;
4. Determines the strategy and tactics of dispute resolution in accordance with ethical standards;
5. Draws up contracts and other legal documents, demonstrates skills to generally participate in legal proceedings and perform procedural actions, and furnishes research and practical projects under the supervision;
6. Uses modern information and communication technologies to search for information in native and English languages; conveys information orally and in writing using legal terminology;

Program Features:

The broad choice between comparative private and international law components enables a student to shape his/her profile in either way: to make emphasis on comparative private law or on international law or to combine components from both concentrations and develop competencies most suitable for prospective employment. Methods employed are widely based on the mixture of interactive teaching and promotion of independent personal development through a combination of theoretical components and practical experience, aiming at the development of skills and values needed to interpret the law in line with the requirements of human rights primacy, i.e. equality and proportionality.

Program structure:

The master's program consists of 120 ECTS distributed as follows:

12 ECTS - core courses for the formation of a uniform basis standard of knowledge in the direction of comparative private law and public international law are offered

18+ ECTS - practical components, i.e. various clinics and/or moot courts.

60 ECTS – elective components. The student also has the opportunity to acquire 18 ECTS based on the rule of free credits, including from the MBA program

30 ECTS - preparation and defense of a Master's Thesis.

Program aims:

- Program aims at developing competences in the fields of comparative private and/or public international law needed for conducting activities at internationally active national, as well as international and transnational institutions, get acquainted student with modern developments in respective fields and be able to conduct independent research.

Learning outcomes:

Demonstrates broad and systematic, well-grounded knowledge in the field of chosen concentration (comparative private law or public international law) and their modern achievements and development trends; considers the alignment of national law with the international legal system, especially with reference to the EU law, which allows for the generation of new, original ideas and a deeper understanding of the role of the lawyer in a changing and globally reshaped environment.
2. Exhibits profound knowledge of legal methods, academic research and ethical principles to solve practical and theoretical complex problems;
3. Demonstrates in depth knowledge of legal and in particular judicial ethics

In order to be employed in a separate listed position, in accordance with the legislation, it is necessary to pass the state certification exam and/or meet other additional prerequisites provided by the legislation of Georgia. A graduate can continue studies at the PhD level.

Program title: PhD in Law

Study Level: Doctoral

Enrolment Requirement: Master of Laws or equivalent degree. The candidate's experience and capabilities are taken into account. To be admitted to the program, the candidate is required to have previous work/publication in the relevant field, and/or experience in participating in scientific-research project(s) and events (in the legal field), which is confirmed by the applicant's resume and relevant Annexes.

A brief description of the PhD research idea (evaluated by the admissions committee) and a motivation letter (goals of PhD education, study in the PhD program in Law, career aspirations, etc.).

Knowledge of English at level B2, which is confirmed by an appropriate certificate or university exam.

Interview with the admissions committee (includes an interview and an interview/presentation on the research topic to the admissions committee).

The PhD student also selects a preferred supervisor/co-supervisor from New Vision University School of Law based on his/her research interests. The PhD student is supported by the School of Law in the process of selecting a supervisor and obtaining his/her approval.

Program Features:

Introduction to the basic research tools is provided in the first semester of the doctoral program through specific core course schedule (Basic Tools for Ph.D. Research). Skills gained within this framework enable students to get acquainted with the organizational tools of the PhD-research, to learn specificities of working with primary sources while incorporating secondary sources.

The primary method utilized in the program is the practice of "learning by doing," which demands that a student submits components referred to an own doctoral thesis.

Program structure:

The educational component of the program consists of 60 ECTS, which are acquired over 2-4 semesters, depending on the individual needs of the PhD student.

The core study components consist of 45 ECTS:

In the first semester, the basic research methods are introduced through the main tools of PhD research (15 ECTS), in which the “learning by doing” method is used - the student studies the organization of research, working with primary and secondary sources, and presents the title of the PhD thesis and related components. In the same (or subsequent) semester, the student has the opportunity to master the course

“Teaching Methods I” (15 ECTS). The list of mandatory components of the curriculum also includes the course Seminar I (15 ECTS). The doctoral student, according to individual needs, in accordance with the credits to be acquired, chooses from the offered courses “Teaching Methods II” and “Seminar II”.

Research Component - The dissertation involves the completion and submission of several components (Supervised Research I, II, and III; Colloquium I and II), but this component is not graded. The dissertation defense is the final stage of the PhD program.

Program aims:

The goal of the program is promoting the free development of the individual and broadening the horizons of the individual, through deepening existing knowledge and introducing new methods in the field of lawmaking and/or interpretation of legal norms;
Promoting the development of competencies required for research and teaching, in line with Level VIII of the National Qualifications Framework

Study Methodology:

The main teaching philosophy of the PhD Program in Law is “learning by doing.” The teaching methods used are:

Program Features:

The program combines theoretical and practical courses in business administration, as well as a concentration in civil engineering, within the framework of which students will master the fundamental issues of civil engineering and will be able to see the processes taking place in the construction sector from the perspective of business management.

During the study period, students will be provided with practical training, which will allow them to obtain the theoretical knowledge and practical experience necessary for further employment.

Program structure:

The bachelor's program consists of 240 ECTS distributed as follows:

30 ECTS - general competencies (GC) component, including 18 core credits. This component is aimed at developing critical thinking and writing skills, as well as the ability to plan and conduct small-scale research. Students can tailor their learning by choosing two elective courses based on their individual needs.

138 ECTS - profile-determining core component: 138 ECTS, divided between Business Administration (72 credits) and Civil Engineering (66 credits).

36-72 ECTS - elective component of the specialty. At least 18 ECTS from Business Administration and the same number of credits from Civil Engineering. Students must select

disciplines from these fields, totaling between 36 and 72 ECTS, to expand their professional competencies, knowledge, and practical skills.

36 ECTS - free component. Students can earn up to 36 ECTS by choosing courses from other BA-level programs offered at NVU, providing further flexibility and customization of their educational experience.

Program aims:

- The program aims to develop competitive professionals by providing students with a comprehensive education in business management within the construction industry. It equips them with the necessary knowledge and practical skills in management, finance, accounting, civil engineering, sustainable development and business communication. Through a diverse curriculum, the program offers students the flexibility to freely expand their knowledge by choosing from various specialized directions, thereby enhancing their ability to adapt and excel in the dynamic fields of business and construction.

Program Features:

The program includes a variety of concentrations, allowing students to gain in-depth knowledge in football administration, financial services (insurance and leasing), cultural heritage administration, and healthcare administration. Students have the opportunity to undergo practical training in companies owned by New Vision University, gaining both the theoretical knowledge and practical experience necessary for future employment.

Program structure:

The bachelor's program consists of 240 ECTS distributed as follows:

30 ECTS – a combination of core and elective general competence courses. Students are expected to complete three mandatory courses worth 18 ECTS and garner addition 12 ECTS through elective courses.

102 ECTS - core business courses to build a strong foundation in business principles and enhance professional competencies, knowledge, and practical skills, including a capstone project worth 30 credits.

30 ECTS - semesters V-VI are dedicated to concentrations. Students select one of these concentrations to tailor their individual profiles. Each concentration includes internships at university-owned companies.

- Financial Services (Insurance and Leasing)
- Healthcare Administration
- Football Administration
- Cultural Heritage Administration

78 ECTS – students can choose disciplines from the elective components, totaling at least 78 ECTS. They are also free to earn 60 ECTS by taking courses from other undergraduate programs at NVU.

Program aims:

- The program aims to provide students with a multifaceted education through relevant concentrations in business, healthcare, football, Financial Services (insurance and leasing), and cultural heritage. This will be enhanced by the acquisition of practical skills and awareness of ethical values. Built on a diverse curriculum that includes social 2 responsibility in business management, policy and strategy, entrepreneurship and innovation, operations, human resources, finance, markets, accounting, marketing, strategic communications, leadership, and sustainable development, the program offers students the freedom to choose specializations in specific sectors to achieve career success in both local and global business environments.
- In addition to the above-mentioned common goals, the core component of Business Administration within the program allows for individual core/electives (C/E), tailored to students' interests and profiles.
The concentrations aim to:
- Equip students concentrating in health care administration with knowledge of the organization of the health care field, including health care systems, policies, financial management, ethical considerations, and the foundations, methods, and principles of operations management.
- Provide students concentrating in football administration with insights into football field administration, sports economics, legal and ethical aspects of sports, marketing strategies - including scouting and public relations - and financial investment strategies in football; aims to prepare students for effective leadership and management roles in the global sports industry, particularly within the dynamic field of football.

- Offer students concentrating in financial services (insurance and leasing) an understanding of the insurance and leasing sectors, their institutional and legal frameworks, financial fundamentals—including risk assessment and operational processes—and sales and marketing strategies for these products; helps students grasp the role of technology and innovation in shaping the future of the insurance and leasing industries through hands-on learning and analytical skill development.
- Introduce students concentrating in cultural heritage administration to global perspectives of art and cultural heritage management, art economics, valuation of works of art and cultural heritage, sales and marketing strategies, the role of art as an entrepreneurial field in business development, and the management of museums and galleries, including exhibition design; assists students in understanding the issues of effective management, preservation, and promotion of cultural heritage in a global context.

Throughout the course, students are required to provide analysis, evaluate and review local, regional and international policies as well as to comprehend micro and macroeconomics, human rights, political communication, sociology, political philosophy and psychology, public policy and other related disciplines. Students are also required to learn an additional foreign language that increases their competitiveness at international and local labor markets

Program structure:

The program consists of 240 ECTS distributed as follows:

60 ECTS – a combination of core and elective courses offered in multiple semesters for developing a robust general competence skill set.

120 ECTS – comprising core and elective courses in the fields of political sciences and international relations which are a prerequisite for the major qualification.

30 ECTS – foreign language courses in French, German or Spanish from A1 all the way to B1.2 level as per the CEFR.

30 ECTS – free credits giving students an opportunity to get a minor qualification in business administration or international law.

Program aims:

- The Program aims to provide students with the understanding of the essence of politics and international relations and equip them with skills necessary for carrying out professional activities in a multicultural setting while making them competent and competitive in an international environment. The curriculum design ensures gaining a solid understanding of current political, economic, cultural and social processes of the world and getting insight into the existing scholarly debates in political science and international relations. Students are required to analyse, evaluate and review local, regional and international policies as well as to comprehend micro and macroeconomics, human rights, political communication, sociology, political philosophy and psychology, public policy and other related disciplines.
- International Relations and Politics BA Program envisages learning an additional foreign language that increases the graduates' competitiveness at international and local labour markets. Throughout the study process, students can build their profiles independently choosing subjects from tracks in general competences, foreign languages, political science, international relations, business administration and/or International law.
- Additionally, students will have an opportunity to build professional competence in the area of Business Administration and gain knowledge and practical skills in leadership, management, finance/accounting, marketing, and business communications. Alternatively, students can acquire knowledge in international law enhancing their understanding of politics and international relations from the legal perspective and develop practical skills needed to understand legislative instruments, international mechanisms and tools employed for the resolution of conflicts of interests at an international level.

The MA in the European Union and Eastern Neighbourhood consists of 120 ECTS distributed as follows:

36 ECTS - core courses for the formation of a uniform standard of knowledge and professional skills mainly offered in the first semester.

42 ECTS - a wide range of elective components offered in the second and third semesters. The MA student also has the opportunity to acquire 6 ECTS based on the rule of free credits. The student elects to study courses of their own choice from the University's MA programs.

One of the key aspects of the program is its strong research focus, allowing students to conduct independent studies that contribute to the field of education. Students gain expertise in both qualitative and quantitative research methods to analyze educational data effectively.

Admission to the program follows a cohort system, allowing for the integration of various fields of education and science. To complete the PhD, students must conduct original research and write a dissertation that makes a meaningful contribution to the field.

Program structure:

The educational component of the program consists of 60 ECTS, which are acquired during 2-4 semesters, depending on the individual needs of the doctoral student.

Doctorate, who is admitted to the program, but does not hold a qualification of Master of Education/Master of Education Sciences, is required to pass the course of Fundamentals of Education Science, which is a compulsory prerequisite for passing study component. The volume of the course is 10 ECTS and is compulsory for the doctorates not possessing the named qualification and elective for other doctorates.

Core study component of the program, therefore consists of 45/55 ECTS (45 ECTS in case the doctorate has relevant qualification, 55 ECTS credits for those who don't):

Introduction to the basic research tools within the doctoral program is provided in the first or second semester through a core course "Basic Tools for Ph.D. Research" (15 ECTS), in which the method "learning by doing" is used - the student will learn to organize research, work with primary and secondary sources, and present the title and related components of the doctoral thesis. The student has the opportunity to master the "Teaching Methods and Strategies I" course (15 ECTS).

The list of mandatory components of the study program also includes the course "Seminar I" (15 ECTS) (The seminar is a study component and may not be related to the dissertation). The Doctoral student completes the study component based on own needs and preferences and, in accordance with the available credits, elects "Teaching Methods and Strategies II - Professor's Assistantship" (15 ECTS), "Seminar II" (15 ECTS) or deepens field knowledge and elects "Digital Technologies and Practices in Education" (5 ECTS), "Sociology of Education" (5 ECTS) or "Education Policy" (5 ECTS). Electing the provided courses enables the PhD student to further shape own profile. Research component - the dissertation, includes completion of several components (Guided Research I, II, and III; Colloquium I and II) which are not assessed. Defence of the thesis is the final stage of completing the doctoral program.

To complete the program, a Ph.D. student is required to have two articles published in a peer-reviewed journal indexed by the Web of Science Group Master Journal List (including the Web of Science Core Collection) and the Scimago Journal List (in Q1-Q4 category journals). One of these publications should be published by the Ph.D. student as a first author. It is permissible for one of the articles mentioned above to be accepted for publication.

Program aims:

- By creating a platform for social needs, and, preferably, interdisciplinary research, through implementation of the existing knowledge, new research methods and tools, contributing to the free development of the individual and generating innovative knowledge;
- Support systemic and critical understanding in the field of education science, providing opportunities for widening existing knowledge and application of the innovative methods, including,

in interdisciplinary context, according to cohort, through synthesis of systemic knowledge of education science and the previous field of study of doctorates.

- Consistent implementation of the values of cooperation, concentration on research, creative problem solving, efficiency,
- freedom, equality, justice, impartiality, ethical leadership, innovation, honesty, openness, accountability to society, safety and social involvement in a cohort of doctoral students selected on a semester basis, preparing graduates for academic and scientific activities in areas such as personalized education, digitalization, medical and legal education and others.

The program is grounded in practice-oriented teaching, ensuring maximum student engagement in professional activities, whether through a real-world media environment or research engagement. Students have the ability to immerse themselves in current trends in mass communication while simultaneously mastering the craft of storytelling, across various formats—be it for any type of newsroom, digital platform, or marketing copywriting.

Program structure:

The duration of the bachelor's program is 4 years (8 semesters - 30 credits per semester) and includes 240 credits. The elements required to create a profile are grouped as follows:

- General Competencies (GC) component - 30 credits, including 18 compulsory credits
- Fundamentals of multimedia journalism - 60 credits
- Foreign language communication and sectoral competencies component - at least 12 credits
- Profile-defining core modules - at least 72 credits
 - a) Creative skills - at least 24 credits
 - b) Media workshops - at least 24 credits
 - c) Beat Reporting - at least 24 credits
- Profile defining elective component - 24 credits if necessary
- Free component (if desired, additional specialty (Minor)) - 42 credits.

Along with the profile-defining courses, the student is allowed to accumulate 60 credits within the free component (if desired, an additional specialization (Minor)) from another undergraduate program (s) at NVU. The only limitation of choice is the meeting of the prerequisite of study of the study course. For the formation of the basic qualification, the student must choose a sufficient number of all the compulsory and elective components from the basic modules defining the profile to accumulate at least 120 credits. Credits from all other electives can be used to accumulate a total of 240 credits.

Program aims:

1. To provide broad knowledge and skills corresponding to the professional requirements of multimedia journalism for finding facts, comparing and analysing them, solving practical tasks;
2. To outline the role and mission of a journalist in a democratic society, the importance of journalistic ethics and social responsibility;
3. To develop self-esteem and the ability for continuous self-development. In addition to the above-mentioned general aims from the compulsory component of multimedia journalism, separate compulsory elective modules of the program aim to:
 - a) The Creative Skills module, taking into account the student's interests and profile, teaches the student the basics, methods, and principles of videography, editing, graphic design through practical training; develops students' creative abilities.
 - b) The Media Workshops module, taking into account the student's interests and profile, will teach the student the specifics of working on different journalism platforms; technologies of information acquisition, archiving, management and processing; TV journalism, radio journalism, social media reporting, podcasting, documentary photography, mobile journalism, basics of producing or entrepreneurship - their role and function, developing trends and peculiarities of modern journalism.
 - c) The Beat Reporting module, taking into account the student's interests and profile, will teach the student about information acquisition and reporting standard; Professional and competent beat reporting, based on fundamental concepts and methods; will introduce the student to the specifics and approaches of various fields, as well as discussion and application of knowledge related to this fields in the general media context.

Study Methodology:

The program promotes the development of both theoretical and practical skills through applied teaching methods based on a mix of interactive teaching (including classroom discussions) and independent individual and group learning, including learning by practicing. This is achieved through the combination of theoretical components, problem-solving and practical experience. All this aims to develop the knowledge, skills, and values necessary for successful self-realization and participation in relevant activities in accordance with the ever-changing labor market

Learning outcomes:

Knowledge and Understanding:

1. Describes the foundations, basic theories, methods and principles of modern journalism; problems of multimedia journalism, news journalism, textual and visual narration, "storytelling", artificial intelligence and media relations; journalistic standards and norms of professional ethics, modern media trends and latest directions of media and communications, significant achievements; concepts and terms used in the field of journalism, - both in Georgian and in English languages. In addition to the above-mentioned general outcomes from the compulsory component of the basics of multimedia journalism, as a result of the study of individual compulsory elective modules of the program:
 - a) The Creative Skills module - explains the specifics of working on multimedia platforms, using specific digital methods in the field of modern journalism;
 - b) The Media Workshops module - describes the importance of specific directions of media in modern journalism; technologies of information acquisition, storage, management and processing; modern forms of storytelling on multimedia platforms; methods of identifying fake news and principles of objective journalism;
 - c) The Beat Reporting module - Lists the features of the coverage of specific areas, the ways of spreading information, the trends of competent coverage of the development of specific areas of modern life.

Skills

- Identifies complex and unforeseen problems in the field of journalism, using existing or latest methods, discusses the appropriate ways to solve the problem, orally and in writing way develops, rationalizes and conveys conclusions using industry terminology;
- Analyzes important achievements in the field of journalism, separate theories, methods, and principles for different types and formats of media -be it broadcast, online, or other -in order to solve the set task;
- Identifies and measures digital audience, their behavior, engagement and interest using appropriate methods in accordance with the legal, marketing, and economic environment; analyzes the ways of spreading information on the Internet and/or social media; distributes digital content to a wide audience through various platforms;
- by finding, processing and systematizing information from various sources using information and communication technologies, creates research and/or practical projects in accordance with predetermined guidelines and presents them in professional circles, establishes communication with both representatives of the field of journalism and non-specialists - in Georgian and English languages;

In addition to the above-mentioned general skills from the compulsory component of the basics of multimedia journalism, as a result of studying the individual compulsory elective modules of the program, the student:

- a) The Creative skills module - develops skills to solve a specific problem using videography, editing, graphic design and editing, express themselves fluently, and work in accordance with modern requirements of journalism.

- b) The Media Workshops module - uses the forms and methods necessary for informing the public: television and radio journalism, social media reporting, podcast, documentary photography, and mobile journalism (MOJO) - technologies necessary for production and/or entrepreneurship;
- c) Beat Reporting module - analyzes the information obtained in the specific field, processes, distributes and reports the problems of these fields;

Responsibility and Autonomy:

1. Demonstrates the ability to constantly deepen their knowledge, observe current media processes, self-develop, taking into account priorities;
2. In a complex, unpredictable environment, makes professional decisions based on ethical principles with adequate awareness of responsibility;
3. Understands the challenges of modern journalism in the digital age, the importance of fact-checking and the techniques of detecting fake news, upholds journalistic standards and professional ethics.

Field of Employment

After completing the studies, the graduate of the bachelor's educational program can continue their studies in the master's degree in the relevant specialty; They can be employed in local and international media organizations: online, radio and TV broadcasts, printed publications, internet portals, also in local and international organizations working in the field of media and communications such as independent studios, PR and marketing companies, advertising agencies, media research centers/projects; In public relations and communications departments of public institutions and private companies, non-governmental and non-profit organizations.
